<u>TODAY'S SPEAKER</u>: Pam Dobbins, LMFT and Director of Mental Health, Switzer Learning Center

Switzer Learning Center is located in Central Torrance and provides a nurturing environment for children who are struggling educationally, emotionally and behaviorally. They are non-profit special education program for students from 3rd through 12th grade. Students are referred from their home school district when they have been unsuccessful in a traditional school. Each student works with a highly trained team of credentialed special education teachers, counselors, therapists and behavior interventionists who are dedicated to helping children with exceptional needs. Their teachers use therapeutic instructional skills and effective curriculum to guide and encourage each child in mastering specific challenges. In this supportive environment, their children are able to take the risks necessary to learn differently. Switzer Learning Center is a place to hope and learn and grow; a place for children who need personalized special education; a place that graduates capable young adults, and a place that offers special education, diagnostic and treatment programs. Pam is excited that they will soon be opening their Family Services Clinic offering assessments, cognitive-behavioral adolescent groups,

and active parenting groups. She shared that learning disabilities can be hard to identify. She had some interesting examples for us to experience some of the challenges and/or frustrations that students encounter. 


