Thank you Mark for your year of service and dedication. You have done an excellent job leading us as LTG.



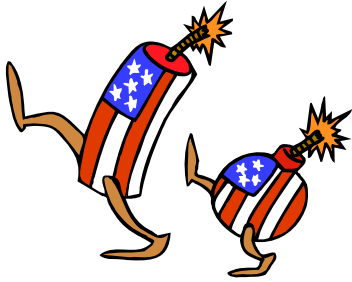
