**Program – Kathleen Taylor – President and Owner of Cadence Voice Over Services:** Kathleen is active in the Torrance Community. She is a graduate of Leadership Torrance 2011 and an ambassador for the Torrance Area Chamber of Commerce. She explains that voice over services are either commercial or narration. Commercial is when someone is trying to sell you something and narration includes audio books, documentaries and recorded voice. The majority of the voice over business is narration.

There are 6 tips to successful voice over. 1) It is important to read and then re-read your material to understand the content and the rhythm. Practice reading aloud the way you want your audience to hear you. 2) Imagine speaking to someone you know to make it sound real. 3) Decide what the message is, connect to the listener and establish trust with a genuine voice. 4) Determine the emotion and the mood, how do you want the listener to feel? 5) When breathing use your diaphragm, breathing is connected to the tone of the voice over. Breathing should match the script. 6) Exercise your face. Kiwanis members got to practice exercising their faces with Kathleen. This was a very interesting program. Thank you Kathleen.

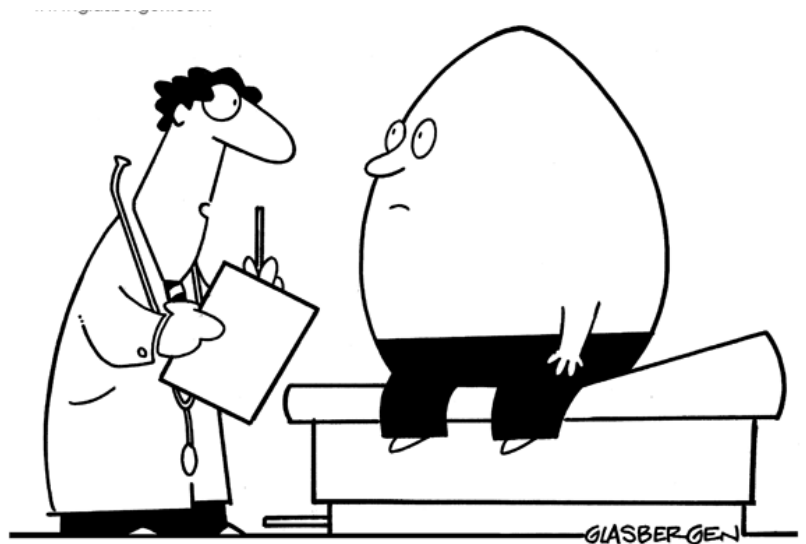
