#### TODAY'S PROGRAM:

**Milton Herring and Ryan Mand, Torrance City Council Candidates:** The Torrance Kiwanis Club is fortunate to have two of its family running for Torrance City Council, member Milton Herring and Ryan Mand son of member Ryoko Mand. The election is June 3<sup>rd</sup>, learn more about this upcoming and important election by visiting [www.TorranceVotes.org](http://www.TorranceVotes.org).

**Ryan Mand:** Ryan, son of member Ryoko Mand, is a student at El Camino College and a Philosophy/History Major. His goal is to become a lawyer. At El Camino he has been involved in student government. He has lived in Torrance his entire life and offers a unique perspective on our city. He represents a different demographic and hopes to inspire others, especially young adults. He wants students to have no fear about failure. Ryan is passionate about the sustainability of our environment and concerned about global warming and CO<sup>2</sup> emissions. He would like to see Torrance pursue installing solar panels at the Civic Center. Ryan is also concerned about unfunded liabilities and the possibility of Torrance installing parking meters to defray the costs of these liabilities. Another issue of importance is the continued operation of SoCalRoc (formally known as SCROC). The possibility of SoCalRoc not receiving State support has been a possibility for the last few years and would have a negative impact on students who are not choosing a 4-year college track. Ryan was extremely well-spoken, passionate and had many great ideas.

**Milton Herring:** 24 years ago, Milton relocated with his family to Torrance. He and his wife Cinda did research on different areas and chose Torrance for 4 reasons: The good school system, good property values, a safe community with the TPD and TFD, and great parks and recreation. His children all attended Torrance schools. Milton would like to promote Discover Torrance and have Torrance become more of a destination place. He is also concerned about the infrastructure of our roads and sewer systems. Milton has served as a Traffic Commissioner for the City of Torrance for 2 years. Milton had a career with the Department of Veterans Affairs as a Chaplain and served for a period of time as the Chief of Chaplain Services. In 1985, Milton was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant Chaplain in the United States Army Reserves. He served two active duty tours in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in the Middle East (Kuwait and Iraq), 2004-2005, and 2008-2009. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel in 2009. He was responsible for the planning and implementing the commander's program to provide support to over 7,500 service members, civilian employees, and their families. He was responsible for 10 installations throughout the country of Kuwait and made several visits to soldiers in southern Iraq. Milton's awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal with 3 oak leaves, Air Force Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal (5th award), National Defense Medal (2nd award), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Expeditionary Service Medal, and the Armed Forces Reserve Medal (with bronze hourglass and "M" device). Milton has served as a community pastor and organizer for many years. Milton, thank you for your service and dedication to your community and to your country.
