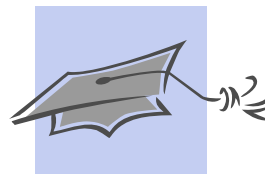

JUDGE BENJAMIN ARANDA III/TORRANCE SCHOLARSHIP: The Benjamin Aranda III was a well-known and respected South Bay Municipal Court Judge. Ben was one of the leading forces to organize the Torrance Kiwanis Club in 1987. He was a former member of the El Segundo Kiwanis Club when he was appointed to the bench. Since the Kiwanis was a men's club Ben terminated his membership when he came a judge. In 1987 when Kiwanis International amended their By-Laws to include women members Ben help form the Torrance Kiwanis. After Ben's unexpected death in 1998, the Torrance Kiwanis Board renamed our annual scholarship in his memory

RALPH THOMPSON SCHOLARSHIP: Ralph Thompson was the Torrance Kiwanis Club President in 2005 – 2006. Ralph always kept us entertained with trivia, jokes and just good old fashioned fun. In 2010 Ralph lost his battle with cancer. He was the Robotics Engineering Leader, on the Math Team and in KIWIN'S. He is also a member of the California Scholarship Federation, Youth and Government and the President for 2 years with Taiwanese Chinese American Club. In addition he has participated in Track and Field and Cross Country for 4 years and was Co-Captain for 2 years. Matt volunteers at Little Company of Mary Hospital and says his favorite task is discharging patients. He is the first violinist with the El Camino Community Orchestra, helps with YMCA projects and is on the Advisory Committee for the ATTIC.

Matt's Youth & Government Advisor, Brent Sheehan, has worked with hundreds of students in the program and says that if he had to choose one student he would want in his own class at USC it would be Matt for his intelligence, his seriousness of purpose, his ability to take instruction well and for the moral center which allows him to connect with adults and peers alike. Stephanie Quick writes that Matt is focused, diligent and efficient and these qualities have allowed him to shine academically, socially, and personally. She has volunteered with Special Olympics, the Molina Book Foundation, at the Madrona Marsh, and tutoring at Hull and Madrona Middle Schools. In addition she helps at a variety of community events. Kailee says that community service has awakened her compassion towards others and has encouraged her to find as many volunteer opportunities as she can for her club and others. In her essay addressing the question “Who or what has made a difference in your life and why?” She writes of her experience with one of her students and all that he taught her. This young boy came to Bible School to feel love. He was the hardest to control, a wild one running, dashing, skipping, leaping and pulled at her patience. She eloquently writes that he softened her heart and slipped in when she wasn’t looking and ran free inside her sheltered American heart. He showed me that the paved roads and skyscrapers of my heart were too conscripted and too rigid. The lessons he taught will stay with me always.

Linda has a weighted GPA of 4.2. She is currently taking AP English Literature, AP Calculus, AP Government and Politics and AP Macroeconomics.

Alexandra Muise – Torrance High School – Ralph Thompson Scholarship: Alexandra plans to enter the medical field because she enjoys science and because of her brother, a cancer survivor. She is striving to attend medical school but also wants to experience engineering, so biomedical engineering is her perfect balance. In the spirit of the Ralph Thompson Scholarship, Alexandra personifies his belief in service. She has volunteered as a Catholic peer minister/leader at her church with the mission to guide her candidates through their two year journey to confirmation. Her candidates helped her grow and taught her about being genuine and passionate. She has also been a camp counselor for a camp for cancer survivors and their siblings, called Camp Summersault. This experience helped her to gain a new perspective while discovering the amazing way these kids live with and overcome their disabilities. KIWIN’S is a large part of her life. 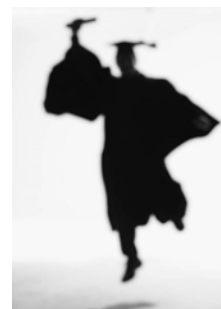

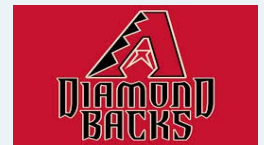
