PROGRAM:

Susan Swinburne, Director of Advancement and Community Affairs, Arts and Services for the Disabled. Founded in Long Beach in 1982 by Helen Dolas, Arts and Services for the Disabled (ASD) uses the creative arts therapies to reach and teach individuals with disabilities, working with them through play and music to achieve their non-musical goals. The ASD Clinic was founded on the theories and principles of A.H. Maslow and ASD's core belief of Love Before Learning. This outpatient treatment program is for children, adolescents and adults with various disabilities such as: Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy, Intellectual Disabilities, Acquired Brain Injuries, Physical Injuries, and other Socio-Emotional Disorders. They believe that each person is unique and has an innate preference in how they access and achieve their own learning needs. This was an incredible challenge for the founders in beginning: finding a community that would believe these services were tremendously needed and understand that by providing programs utilizing the creative arts in a specific methodology and therapeutic approach (not art and crafts!) they could improve the quality of life for developmentally disabled individuals. ASD is having their largest fundraiser this June 14th at the Museum of Latin American Art Sculpture Gardens. 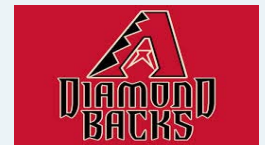


