Ellen Silver and Ed Lynch from Mychal's Learning Place

### **TODAY'S PROGRAM:**

Ed Lynch, Executive Director and Founder Mychal's Learning Place and Ellen Silver, Assistant. Mychal's Learning Place opened in July 2002 in Hawthorne. It began as an after school program for children with special needs. With a large demand for support a second location was opened in Culver City. Mychal's Learning Place started as a social recreational program but has expanded to now teach skills to help youngsters become independent. Their program includes music, computers, art, kitchen skills and laundry skills. The program hopes to empower for success and further hopes the parents reinforce and continue the program at home. A year ago an adult program was added for those 18 – 30. They prepare their own lunches, going to the market, checking expiration dates and checking out. They learn about job training with an emphasis on hygiene, interaction with peers, and being punctual. Mychal's receives 60% of their funding support from the Regional Center and the remaining 40% from fundraising. The next step for Mychal's is to buy their own building so the

program will carry on and to duplicate Mychal's in other locations. Ed spoke from his heart and his love for his daughter, his inspiration, was very evident. Mychal was born with developmental and physical disabilities but had an amazing spirit. During her short life she never lost her sense of humor or the love in her heart. Ed shared that he was blessed because Mychal chose him as her father.



### **Mychal's Mission Statement**

Mychal's Learning Place believes that children and adults with developmental disabilities deserve to be challenged with opportunities that build self-esteem and independence, creating long term success for life.

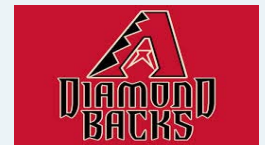


