TODAY'S PROGRAM: Program – Barbara Maynard – Empowering the Americas, El Salvador, Summer 2014: Barbara began her presentation with an explanation of why and how this project began. Her daughter, Anya, whom she adopted from Kazakhstan as a single mom was the impetus. She raised her daughter deemphasizing holidays and gift giving. But when Anya reached age 9 she bought her an iPad for Christmas not prepared for the reaction which was not as appreciative as expected. Barbara realized that she needed to get the RHE mentality out of her daughter and find a meaningful project. She solicited ideas through social media and learned from a friend that grew up in El Salvador of a need. There is a women's cooperative located at Isla la Tasajera, La Paz. This co-op serves over 15 women, who make handbags, and their children. Schooling requires the children to take a 10 minute ride from the island to the mainland and there is a \$5.00 fare which is cost prohibitive. On August 17th fifteen women and young children will be traveling to El Salvador for a week to volunteer in this war-torn and gang-infested country. They will be establishing a
