TODAY'S PROGRAM: Brandon Adachi and Ginelle Amormino. Bradon Adachi is the development manager for Special Olympics which is a non-profit that empowers children and adults of disability to participate in sports. Special Olympics has events all year round. From July 25 to August 2, 2015, the World Games will be held in Los Angeles. 7,000 athletes from 170 countries will compete in 25 sports for a 9 day event. The athletes are from 8 to 72 years of age. There are many volunteer opportunities (minimum age is 14 years) and individuals can be fans and cheer for the athletes. There a need for medical volunteers. Ginelle Amormino is a physical therapist and professor at USC. She started being involved 20 years ago. She helps with the training for tennis, soccer and swimming. She screens for flexibility, balance, strength, and endurance. Free screening is given for hearing and sight. A bowling event was held where volunteers and athletes could get to know one another. In November, there will be a 5K fundraiser where USC and UCLA compete with one another.

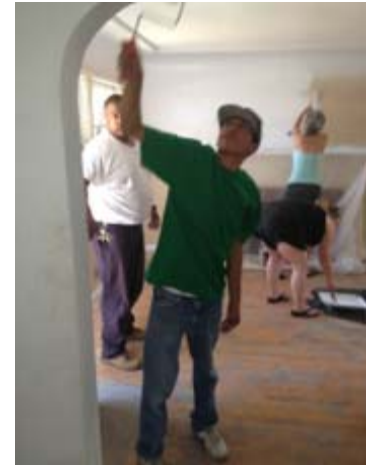

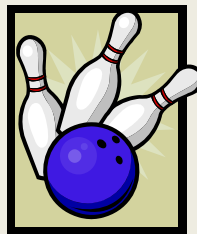
