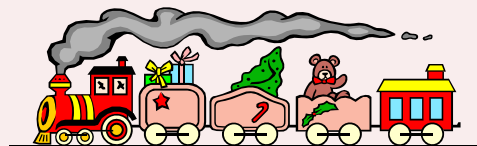
overseas. With your help, donating new unwrapped toys for children ages 0-16, will give children of deployed parents overseas a happy holiday season.
